VETERANS' TEA AND CONCERT.

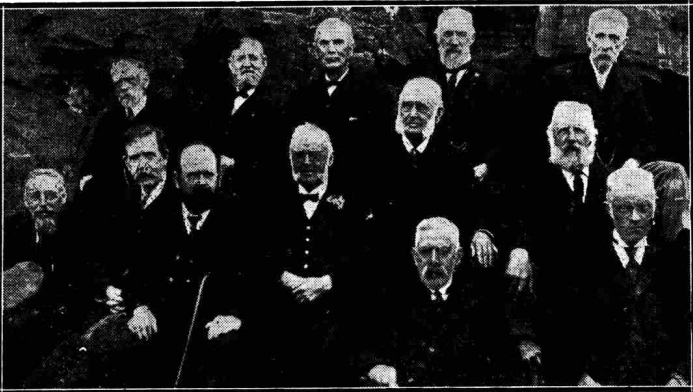

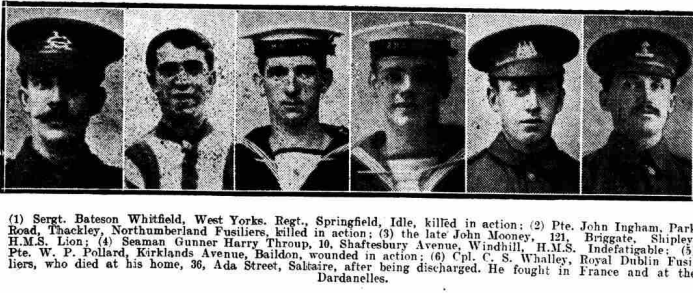
