

Cpl William Gray L4364

157th Brigade Royal Field Artillery Aberdeen

- This brigade was originally comprised of A, B, C and D Batteries RFA (each of four 18-pounder field guns) and the Brigade Ammunition Column and was raised in Aberdeen. It was placed under command of the 35th Division and went to France with it on 30 January 1916. □ On 25 May 1916 the Brigade Ammunition Column left and was merged into the 35th Divisional Ammunition Column.
- On 28 May 1916 "D" Battery left to go to CLXIII, where it became "A" Battery. In exchange, "A" (Howitzer) Battery joined from CLXIII and became this brigade's "D" (Howitzer) Battery.
- On 9 September 1916 the brigade was joined by "A" Battery from CLXIII (Howitzer) Brigade, which was split up to bring "A" and "B" Batteries up to six guns each. A section of two also joined from "C" Battery of CLVIII and was added to "C" Battery.
- On 9 January 1917 a section joined from "C" Battery of CLVIII and was added to "D" (Howitzer) Battery.
